The quality desired in agricultural and horticultural products exhibits is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market, and such exhibits must be at least equal in maturity to that state or ripeness required by Section 42513 of the California Agricultural Code in order to be considered for premium awards.

1. Refer to “**Notice to Exhibitors**” rules 2&3 for entry dates.
2. Entries must be in place by 7:00pm WEDNESDAY
3. Entries will be displayed in the Junior Bldg.
4. Variety of products must be adequately and correctly labeled.
5. All exhibits must remain in place on the fairgrounds until 5 p.m., SUNDAY.
