

JUNIOR RABBIT

American System of Judging

Rules, Definitions and Judging procedures as prescribed in the latest edition of the Guide Book and Standard of the American Rabbit Breeders' Association, Inc., shall apply to all District Fair Rabbit Shows, provided they do not conflict with any of the rules and regulations prescribed by the Department of Food and Agriculture.

1. Refer to "**Notice to Exhibitors**" rules 2&3 for entry due dates.
2. All rabbits must be in place by 5 p.m., THURSDAY. Rabbits will be accepted between the hours of 1 p.m. and 3 p.m., THURSDAY. No rabbits will be accepted prior to this time. For special arrangements call the Fair Office at 279-2315.
3. All rabbits must remain on the fairgrounds until 5 p.m., SUNDAY, and MUST be removed by 5 p.m.
4. Cages will be furnished by the fair. Exhibitors will furnish their own watering containers, feed and feeders.
5. All animals must be identified by permanent ear markings conforming with the entry form on arrival at the show. ALL TATTOOING IS TO BE DONE PRIOR TO FAIR. Any duplication of ear markings by one exhibitor in the same Division must be eliminated and the change recorded on the judging sheet before judging begins. NO MORE THAN 2 CHANGES PER EXHIBITOR PRIOR TO SHOW.
6. Health Inspector's decision is final. Disqualification from show will be the result of any infringement or argument regarding this rule. No medication is to be used that in any way alters the appearance or performance of the animal.
7. The age in MONTHS (i.e. 4 months) must be stated on the entry form for each animal entered.
8. EXHIBITOR IS REQUIRED TO SHOW THEIR OWN ANIMAL unless prior arrangements are made with Show Management. If exhibitor has more than one entry in a class, another 4-H or FFA member may show the second animal.
9. 4-H and FFA club/chapter entries will be caged in the same area to encourage decorations that identify the group and make cleaning chores easier. All materials must be arranged so as not to present any kind of interference or danger to the public, other exhibitors or the rabbits.
